Horatio Spafford was a successful lawyer and real estate investor. He and his wife, Anna, had five children. He was involved in his church and community.

In 1871, their 4-year old son died of illness, and Horatio lost most of his business in the great Chicago fire. Two years later, Anna and their daughters were aboard an

ocean liner that was struck, and sank within 12 minutes. Of his family, only Anna survived. Can you imagine Horatio's grief upon receiving this tragic news?

Crossing the Atlantic to meet his wife, Horatio's ship passed right by the place where his daughters had drowned. It was there that he wrote the words to the hymn "It Is Well with My Soul."

"When peace, like a river, attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, it is well, it is well with my soul."

Following such loss, how could he write these words of trust? The third verse of the hymn tells us: "My sin, not in part but the whole, is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more, praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul!"

Psalm 116 shows God's mercy: He "delivered my soul from death." I hold on to this powerful truth and amazing hope: Jesus, and what He did on the cross, has given me eternal life.

With Him, we can face our difficult times and say: "It is well with my soul."
